## Donor Campaign Surges, Enabling Williamsburg Clinic to Acquire Heart Health Equipment

WHEN THE PAULEY HEART CENTER EXPANDED its clinical operation to support the Williamsburg community in 2021, residents gained local access to heart health assessments and chronic disease management as well as risk reduction assessment and management.

To ensure their ability to best serve patients, the clinical team identified advanced screening tools — such as echocardiography machines, CPET and stress testing equipment — that would enhance patient care. Because gifts made through the Pauley Society are unrestricted and available



to meet Pauley's most pressing needs, center leaders were able to direct more than \$216,000 to purchase the cardiac equipment vital to caring for our patients.

Bob and Margaret Hershberger understood the importance of this equipment. "We are glad to learn that our gift through the Pauley Society supported this effort," said said the Williamsburg couple. "We were impressed to learn how the new equipment will offer local patients access to state-of-the-art care within their community without the need to drive to a neighboring city."

"I am heartened by the support of this community," said Hem Bhardwaj, M.D. "The new equipment heralds a game-changing advantage for patients, enabling us to deliver accessible, timely and continuous cardiac care that optimizes patient outcomes. The new equipment will support patients from our greater Williamsburg area and the Hampton Roads region with preventive and diagnostic testing – and that frees space at the VCU Medical Center in Richmond for our more complex patients."

Thanks to unrestricted donations, the Williamsburg clinic will begin using the new equipment this fall.

## Medical Students Educate Kids on Heart Health with Pauley Society Support

**TEACH BP**, a pilot program started in 2021 by researchers at the Pauley Heart Center, will expand into three Hopewell, Virginia, public elementary schools this fall. Partially underwritten by donations from the Pauley Society, the program will expand opportunities for over 300 children to learn about exercise, nutrition and generational change. The hands-on program, supported by student volunteers from VCU's schools of medicine, pharmacy and dentistry, will teach children how to take blood pressure and raise awareness at home about the benefit of preventive cardiovascular screenings. Data collected from the program will support efforts to identify future funding partners to expand the program throughout the commonwealth.
